

# **PUBLIC NOTICE REGARDING GOVERNOR GAVIN NEWSOM'S EXECUTIVE ORDER N-33-20**

**\*Currently In Effect\***

**Effective Beginning 12:01 a.m. on March 19, 2020 Until Further Notice  
Compliance with this Order is Mandatory**

Generally, essential businesses that may remain open are identified as those who people rely upon to conduct their day-to-day activities. Even establishments that are permitted to remain open should practice adequate precautionary procedures for both employees and patrons in order to prevent the potential spread of COVID-19 (Novel Coronavirus). These precautionary procedures include (and are not limited to) social distancing and adequate sanitization within businesses and the outside premises. In addition, businesses that are permitted to remain open must limit the number of employees and customers that are allowed within the business within any given time in order to ensure social distancing. Businesses must also post signage detailing the need and importance of social distancing, and must place markings (such as tape) in six-foot intervals at cash registers and self-checkout station, as well as the outside of the establishment where customers await their turn to enter the building, to ensure social distancing and the health and safety of all.

It is important to note that no one is prohibited from working remotely from their home should their business be considered non-essential, however, customers are not permitted on site.

The following is a non-exhaustive list of businesses that may remain open and those that shall close. The following list is compliant with Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-33-20 that was issued on March 19, 2020.

This list may be updated two times a week, at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesdays and Fridays, as necessary. To view the latest information regarding this public notice, please check the City of Mendota's webpage. ## **BUSINESSES THAT MAY REMAIN OPEN:**

*The following business types may remain open and must ensure implementation and compliance with the aforementioned precautionary procedures.*

- Accounting, bookkeeping, payroll
- Agriculture
- Alarm and security companies
- Animal boarding
- Appliance sales, repair, in home only
- Auto repair, service, supplies, and smog testing

- Auto sales, provided transactions are handled electronically and delivery of vehicles is to the customers' home (showrooms and vehicle lots shall not be open to customers)
- Banks and other financial services
- Blood donation centers
- Businesses that supply essential businesses with necessary supplies (e.g., office or restaurant supply stores)
- Businesses that supply items required to work from home
- Businesses that provide training and/or certification for employment, or to maintain or renew a government approved license or permit, but solely for those purposes (not for recreation)
- Busses
- Car washes--exterior only, customer remains in vehicle
- Childcare and adult care facilities\*
- Community garden
- Construction - all construction in progress may continue
- Construction - housing and care facilities
- Construction supplies
- Convenience stores
- Counseling and behavioral health
- Distribution and delivery of essential consumer or business goods
- Domestic violence shelter
- Drug stores
- Electricians
- Essential government services (each public agency to make its own determination - minimize employees and congregations of people)
- Exterminators
- Farmer's markets with produce vegetables
- Farming (all agriculture)
- Food and goods delivery services
- Food banks and other organizations that provide assistance to the disadvantaged
- Food preparation facilities
- Food trucks (but no tables/chairs for customers)
- Gas stations
- Government agencies and facilities as necessary to maintain critical infrastructure
- Grocery stores
- Hardware stores
- Healthcare providers - doctors, dentists, mental health professionals, nurses, hospice
- Home-based care for all
- Home repair and maintenance (landscaping, pool service, repairs)
- Homeless service providers

- Mailing and shipping services
- Malls, if certain businesses within the mall may remain open
- Manufacturing of essential consumer and business goods

- Restaurants (take-out, delivery, drive thru only)

- Utility companies - water, power, cable, internet, cell service
- Veterinarians

**BUSINESSES THAT SHALL CLOSE:**

*All businesses that were not listed above shall close. Here are additional clarifications:*

- Amphitheaters
- Amusement and theme parks or Circus
- Amusement arcades
- Arenas
- Auto sales showrooms and lots
- Banquet halls

- Barbers and hair salons
- Bars
- Car washes (exterior only, customer remains in vehicle allowed)
- Churches (counseling, providing relief, and broadcasting religious services permitted - but no congregations of people)
- Clothing stores
- Craft and fabric stores (may fulfill orders curbside for fabric to be used for COVID-19 relief)
- Dance halls
- Dances
- Fitness Centers
- Furniture stores
- Gymnasiums
- Industrial and manufacturing not expressly permitted
- Liquor stores (grocery and convenience stores permitted)
- Music events
- Nightclubs
- Pool and billiards lounges
- Private social clubs
- Public swimming pools
- Second hand/thrift stores
- Shooting ranges
- Sports stadiums and facilities (all types)
- Swap meet/flea market
- Tattoo and body piercing
- Trampoline and bounce houses
- Water parks

This is not an exhaustive list of businesses that may remain open or must close. \*Childcare facilities providing services that enable employees exempted in this Order to work as permitted. To the extent possible, childcare facilities must operate under the following mandatory conditions: (1) Childcare must be carried out in stable groups of 10 or fewer ("stable" means that the same 10 or fewer children are in the same group each day); (2) Children shall not change from one group to another; (3) If more than one group of children is cared for at one facility, each group shall be in a separate room. Groups shall not mix with each other; (4) Childcare providers shall remain solely with one group of children.

\*\*Sales Offices and Model Homes can be open by appointment only. An appointment consists of one sales associate and one family (defined as immediate family who currently lives in the same

residence and less than 9 individuals) at a time in the sales office or any model home. Have enough hand sanitizers for the employees and the customers. Disinfect the sales offices and model homes prior to opening each day.

\*\*\*Schools for purposes of facilitating distance learning or performing essential functions (including but not limited to administration and provision of community meal programs), observing social distancing and hand cleaning.
